

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

Demography


Census of India 2011:

The total population of the "Dhar" is 2185793 and out of this total population, urban population is 413221 (19%) and rural population is 1772572 (81%). Female population in the district is 1073068 (49%) and male population is 1112725. Hence the sex ratio accounts as 964 females per 1000 males. The Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) population is 145436 and 1222814 respectively.

The total number of households in the Dhar district is 425914. The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act/Scheme (MNREGA) 2021-22 registered labour reports shows 289617 registered household with MNREGA in the district.

Literacy Levels

Overall literacy rate of Dhar is 59 percent, which is lower than the state literacy rate (69.32%). The rural-urban literacy is reported as 54.09 and 79.49 percent. There is a huge gap between the rural and urban literacy rates. Urban literacy is more than the overall district literacy rate. Gender-wise literacy rates indicate that, female literacy is 48.77 percent and it is lower than the male literacy rate. Male literacy rate is 68.95 percent, which is higher than the district literacy rate.



Per Capita NSDP of Madhya Pradesh (in Rs.)









The UDISE+ data also provides the infrastructure and school facilities data at both State and district level. Among the indicators, 6 indicators are selected and provided here. While 58.37% of the schools functioning in Dhar district have electricity connection, 56.54% schools have functional electricity. Similarly, in terms of toilet facility, 94.28% schools have functional girl's toilet whereas it is 90.75% in the case of boy's toilet. Drinking water is the most basic need and 95.58 % of schools in Dhar provided functional drinking water facility in their schools. The overall WASH facility – drinking water, toilet and handwash is provided in 90 percent of schools. As per the data of 2020-21, only 12.53 percent of schools in Dhar have internet facility, whereas 13.69 percent schools have computer available with them.



During 2019-21 (NFHS-5), the district, Dhar recorded 89.2 percent of the population living in households have access to improved drinking water sources. Likewise, population living in households that use an improved sanitation facility also recorded 61.9 percent during the same period. Other basic amenities like clean fuel for cooking is only available for 44.8 % however electricity (97.6 percent) is available for majority of the households.





Health Facilities

According to the Health Management Information System (HMIS) annual report 2019-20, there are five type of health facilities coming under every state health department - Sub Centres (SCs), Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs), Sub-District Hospitals (SDHs) and District Hospitals (DHs), apart from Medical Colleges at top. In the case of district profile, number of medical colleges per district is very limited or rare.

The health facilities pyramid shows the structure of institutions serving the population in both rural and urban areas. There are 20 medical colleges in the state of Madhya Pradesh as per 2019.

In Dhar district, there are 1 district hospital, 15 community health centres, 49 primary health centres and 475 sub-centres as per 2018 data

One of the major indicators on vaccination is – vaccination from private and Government facility. In Dhar, children of age 12-23 months who received most of their vaccinations in a public health facility is 100 percent. 87 percent of the children aged between 12-23 months received the three doses of polio vaccine, as per NFHS 5.

NFHS-5 also provides information regarding the nutritional status of women and children.

- 65.0 percent of children aged between 6-59 months are anaemic.
- Women in the age group of 15-49 also shows high incidence of anaemia (50.2 percent).
