




Demography

Census of India 2011:

The total population of the "Gumla district" is 1025213 and out of this total population, urban population is 65081 (7%) and rural population is 960132 (93%). Female population in the district is 510823 (50%) and male population is 514390. Hence the sex ratio accounts as 993 females per 1000 males. The Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) population is 32459 and 706754 respectively.


The total number of households in the Gumla district is 188988 according to Census data. The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act/Scheme (MNREGA) 2021-22 registered labour reports shows 246737 registered household with MNREGA in the district.

Literacy Levels



Overall literacy rate of Gumla district is 67.99 percent. The rural-urban literacy is reported as 66.59 and 85.46 percent. There is a huge gap between the rural and urban literacy rates. Urban literacy is higher than the overall district literacy rate.



Socio-Economic Profile

The socio-economic profile of Jharkhand indicates that, the state is service sector oriented economy (29 percent). The Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) at current prices for the year 2020-21 is accounted as 317078.73 Rs.Cr. Among the sectors, service sector tops in value added followed by Industry and Manufacturing sectors.



In terms of Per Capita NSDP, between 2018-19 and 2019-20, there is an increase, whereas in 2020-21, it declined to 75587.18 Rs, which can be attributed to pandemic and lockdown in the whole nation.

Main vs Marginal Workers







Educational Status

According to the Unified District Information System for Education (UDISE+), there are 1123 schools functioning in the district. Primary schools, that is from 1st standard to 5th standard are 640 whereas upper-primary schools accounts for 337.

The UDISE+ data also provides the infrastructure and school facilities data at both State and district level. Among the indicators, 6 indicators are selected and provided here. Only 71.95 percent schools have functional electricity. Similarly, in terms of toilet facility, 95.37 percent schools have functional girl's toilet. Drinking water is the most basic need and 98.22 percent of schools in Gumla district provided functional drinking water facility in their schools. The overall WASH facility – drinking water, toilet and handwash is provided in 86.11 percent of schools. As per the data of 2020-21, only 12.02 percent of schools in Gumla district have internet facility, whereas 55.83 percent schools have computer available with them.

Health Status and Basic Amenities

During 2019-21 (NFHS-5), the district, Gumla district recorded 75.2 percent of the population living in households have access to improved drinking water sources. Likewise, population living in households that use an improved sanitation facility also recorded 50.1 percent during the same period. Other basic amenities like clean fuel for cooking is only available for 19.1% however electricity (89.1 percent) is available for majority of the households.




Health Facilities

According to the Health Management Information System (HMIS) annual report 2019-20, there are five type of health facilities coming under every state health department - Sub Centres (SCs), Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs), Sub-District Hospitals (SDHs) and District Hospitals (DHs), apart from Medical Colleges at top.

In the case of district profile, number of medical colleges per district is very limited or rare.

The health facilities pyramid shows the structure of institutions serving the population in both rural and urban areas. There are 3 medical colleges in the state of Jharkhand as per 2019, and in Gumla district there is 1 district hospital.

In Gumla district, there are 6 community health centres, 7 primary health centres and 145 sub-centres as per 2018 data.



Insights from NFHS-5

One of the major indicators on vaccination is – vaccination from private and Government facility. In Gumla district, children of age 12-23 months who received most of their vaccinations in a public health facility is higher (98.9 percent) than private facility. 86.4 percent of the children aged between 12-23 months received the three doses of polio vaccine.

NFHS-5 also provides information regarding the nutritional status of women and children.

- 65.8 percent of children aged between 6-59 months are anaemic.
- Women in the age group of 15-49 also shows high incidence of anaemia (59.5 percent).
