
DISTRICT PROFILE – HARDWAR DISTRICT (Uttarakhand)

Basic Profile

Hardwar is a district in the state of Uttarakhand. The Hardwar ranks 10th in terms of area and 1st in terms of population. There are 3 subdivisions under the district covering 2360 Km² as per census 2011.

Demography


The total population of the "Hardwar" is 1890422 and out of this total population, urban population is 693094 (37%) and rural population is 1197328 (63%). Female population in the district is 885127 (47%) and male population is 1005295. Hence the sex ratio accounts as 880 females per 1000 males. The Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) population is 411274 and 6323 respectively.

The total number of households in the Hardwar district is 338104. The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act/Scheme (MNREGA) 2021-22 registered labour reports shows 207558 registered household with MNREGA in the district.

Literacy Levels

Overall literacy rate of Hardwar is 73.43 percent, which is lower than the state literacy rate (78.82%). The rural-urban literacy is reported as 68.29% and 81.91%. There is a huge gap between the rural and urban literacy rates. Urban literacy is more than the overall district literacy rate.

Gender-wise literacy rates indicate that, female literacy is 64.79% and it is lower than the male literacy rate. Male literacy rate is 81.04%, which is higher than the district literacy rate.




Gender-wise Literacy Rate (%)


GSDP Estimates

The socio-economic profile of Uttarakhand indicates that, the state is service sector oriented economy (57 percent). The Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) at current prices for the year 2020-21 is accounted as 227421 Rs.Cr. Among the sectors, industry sector tops in value added followed by services and manufacturing.



Per Capita NSDP of Uttarakhand (in Rs.)






Main workers Marginal workers


District Level

The worker profile of Hardwar consist of 578121 total workers with 86 percent main workers and 14 percent marginal workers. The gender classification divides the population into 86 % male workers and 14% female workers.

According to the Census 2011, the workers are further classified into cultivators, agricultural labour, household workers and others. In Hardwar, the category of others have the highest share in total workers and household workers have least.



Educational Status

According to the Unified District Information System for Education (UDISE+), there are 2336 schools functioning in the district. Primary schools, that is from 1st standard to 5th standard are 1105 whereas upper-primary schools accounts for 577.

In terms of enrolment, total enrolment in the district, including the pre-primary schools is 490072 during 2020-21.. Enrolment during the same period, excluding pre-primary schools is 472161.



The UDISE+ data also provides the infrastructure and school facilities data at both State and district level. Among the indicators, 6 indicators are selected and provided here. While 98.76% of the schools functioning in Hardwar district have electricity connection, 97.90% schools have functional electricity. Similarly, in terms of toilet facility, 96.88% schools have functional girl's toilet whereas it is 94.22% in the case of boy's toilet. Drinking water is the most basic need and 94.35% of schools in Hardwar provided functional drinking water facility in their schools. The overall WASH facility – drinking water, toilet and handwash is provided in 96.45% of schools. As per the data of 2020-21, only 26.93% of schools in Hardwar have internet facility, whereas 50.30% schools have computer available with them.



Basic Amenities

During 2019-21 (NFHS-5), the district, Hardwar recorded 99.6 percent of the population living in households have access to improved drinking water sources. Likewise, population living in households that use an improved sanitation facility also recorded 69.8 percent during the same period. Other basic amenities like clean fuel for cooking is only available for 61.5 % however electricity (99.7 percent) is available for majority of the households.




Health Facilities

According to the Health Management Information System (HMIS) annual report 2019-20, there are five type of health facilities coming under every state health department - Sub Centres (SCs), Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs), Sub-District Hospitals (SDHs) and District Hospitals (DHs), apart from Medical Colleges at top. In the case of district profile, number of medical colleges per district is very limited or rare.

The health facilities pyramid shows the structure of institutions serving the population in both rural and urban areas. There are 4 medical colleges in the state of Uttarakhand as per 2019.

In Hardwar district, there are 2 district hospital, 7 community health centres, 26 primary health centres and 160 sub-centres as per 2018 data

One of the major indicators on vaccination is – vaccination from private and Government facility. In Hardwar, children of age 12-23 months who received most of their vaccinations in a public health facility is 87.6 percent. 84.1 percent of the children aged between 12-23 months received the three doses of polio vaccine, as per NFHS 5.

NFHS-5 also provides information regarding the nutritional status of women and children.

- 63.1 percent of children aged between 6-59 months are anaemic.
- Women in the age group of 15-49 also shows high incidence of anaemia (43.8 percent).
