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





Basic Profile

Raipur is a district in the state of Chhattisgarh. The Raipur ranks fifth in terms of area and first in terms of population. There are fifteen subdivisions under the district covering 8272 Km<sup>2</sup> as per census 2011.

Demography


The total population of the “Raipur” is 4063872 and out of this total population, urban population is 1483289 (36%) and rural population is 2580583 (64%). Female population in the district is 2015686 (50%) and male population is 2048186. Hence the sex ratio accounts as 984 females per 1000 males. The Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) population is 724250 and 476446 respectively.

The total number of households in the Raipur district is 871225. The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act/Scheme (MNREGA) 2021-22 registered labour reports shows 176454 registered household with MNREGA in the district.

Literacy Levels

Overall literacy rate of Raipur is 75.56 percent, which is higher than the state literacy rate (70.28%). The rural-urban literacy is reported as 70.47 and 84.24 percent. There is a huge gap between the rural and urban literacy rates. Urban literacy is more than the overall district literacy rate.

Gender-wise literacy rates indicate that, female literacy is 65.75 and it is lower than the male literacy rate. Male literacy rate is 85.24 which is higher than the district literacy rate.



## Socio-Economic Profile

The socio-economic profile of Chhattisgarh indicates that, the state is industrial sector oriented economy (37 percent). The Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) at current prices for the year 2020-21 is accounted as 350269.83 Rs.Cr. Among the sectors, industrial sector tops in value added followed service sector.

#### State Level





■ Main workers ■ Marginal workers






#### Number & Area (hectares) of Land Holdings



## Educational Status

According to the Unified District Information System for Education (UDISE+) , there are 2452 schools functioning in the district. Primary schools, that is from 1<sup>st</sup> standard to 5<sup>th</sup> standard are 1001 whereas upper-primary schools accounts for 378.

The UDISE+ data also provides the infrastructure and school facilities data at both State and district level. Among the indicators, 6 indicators are selected and provided here. 100% of the schools functioning in Raipur district have electricity connection. Similarly, in terms of toilet facility, 98.45% schools have functional girl's toilet whereas it is 97.39% in the case of boy's toilet. Drinking water is the most basic need and 100% of schools in Raipur provided functional drinking water facility in their schools. The overall WASH facility – drinking water, toilet and handwash is provided in 98.98 percent of schools. As per the data of 2020-21, only 31.73 percent of schools in Raipur have internet facility, whereas 90.78 percent schools have computer available with them.

## State Level Out of Pocket Expenditure on Health



## Basic Amenities

During 2019-21 (NFHS-5), the district, Raipur recorded 99.7 percent of the population living in households have access to improved drinking water sources. Likewise, population living in households that use an improved sanitation facility also recorded 84.0 percent during the same period. Other basic amenities like clean fuel for cooking is only available for 60.5 % however electricity (99.5 percent) is available for majority of the households.

## Health Facilities


According to the Health Management Information System (HMIS) annual report 2019-20, there are five type of health facilities coming under every state health department - Sub Centres (SCs), Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs), Sub-District Hospitals (SDHs) and District Hospitals (DHs), apart from Medical Colleges at top. In the case of district profile, number of medical colleges per district is very limited or rare.

The health facilities pyramid shows the structure of institutions serving the population in both rural and urban areas. There are 6 medical colleges in the state of Chhattisgarh as per 2019.

In Raipur district, there are 1 district hospital, 11 community health centres, 40 primary health centres and 245 sub-centres as per 2018 data

One of the major indicators on vaccination is – vaccination from private and Government facility. In Raipur, children of age 12-23 months who received most of their vaccinations in a public health facility is 94.5 percent. 86.8 percent of the children aged between 12-23 months received the three doses of polio vaccine, as per NFHS 5.

NFHS-5 also provides information regarding the nutritional status of women and children.

- 74.6 percent of children aged between 6-59 months are anaemic.
- Women in the age group of 15-49 also shows high incidence of anaemia (59.1 percent).
