




The total population of the "Sagar" is 2378458 and out of this total population, urban population is 708796 (30%) and rural population is 1669662 (70%). Female population in the district is 1122201 (47%) and male population is 1256257. Hence the sex ratio accounts as 893 females per 1000 males. The Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) population is 501630 and 221936 respectively.

The total number of households in the Sagar district is 517850. The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act/Scheme (MNREGA) 2021-22 registered labour reports shows 279582 registered household with MNREGA in the district.

## **Literacy Levels**

Overall literacy rate of Sagar is 76.46 percent, which is higher than the state literacy rate (69.32%). The rural-urban literacy is reported as 72.08 and 86.43 percent. There is a huge gap between the rural and urban literacy rates. Urban literacy is more than the overall district literacy rate.

Gender-wise literacy rates indicate that, female literacy is 67.02 percent and it is lower than the male literacy rate. Male higher than the district literacy rate.



# Per Capita NSDP of Madhya Pradesh (in Rs.)











The UDISE+ data also provides the infrastructure and school facilities data at both State and district level. Among the indicators, 6 indicators are selected and provided here. While 74.23% of the schools functioning in Sagar district have electricity connection, 70.61% schools have functional electricity. Similarly, in terms of toilet facility, 93.58% schools have functional girl's toilet whereas it is 91.41% in the case of boy's toilet. Drinking water is the most basic need and 94.86% of schools in Sagar provided functional drinking water facility in their schools. The overall WASH facility – drinking water, toilet and handwash is provided in 72.35 percent of schools. As per the data of 2020-21, only 13.67 percent of schools in Sagar have internet facility, whereas 11.30 percent schools have computer available with them.



#### **Basic Amenities**

During 2019-21 (NFHS-5), the district, Sagar recorded 86.7 percent of the population living in households have access to improved drinking water sources. Likewise, population living in households that use an improved sanitation facility also recorded 68.8 percent during the same period. Other basic amenities like clean fuel for cooking is only available for 32.7 % however electricity (98.6 percent) is available for majority of the households.





## **Health Facilities**

According to the Health Management Information System (HMIS) annual report 2019-20, there are five type of health facilities coming under every state health department - Sub Centres (SCs), Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs), Sub-District Hospitals (SDHs) and District Hospitals (DHs), apart from Medical Colleges at top. In the case of district profile, number of medical colleges per district is very limited or rare.

The health facilities pyramid shows the structure of institutions serving the population in both rural and urban areas. There are 20 medical colleges in the state of Madhya Pradesh as per 2019.

In Sagar district, there are 1 district hospital, 11 community health centres, 32 primary health centres and 266 sub-centres as per 2018 data

One of the major indicators on vaccination is – vaccination from private and Government facility. In Sagar, children of age 12-23 months who received most of their vaccinations in a public health facility is 99.0 percent. 79.2 percent of the children aged between 12-23 months received the three doses of polio vaccine, as per NFHS 5.

NFHS-5 also provides information regarding the nutritional status of women and children.

- 83.3 percent of children aged between 6-59 months are anaemic.
- Women in the age group of 15-49 also shows high incidence of anaemia (49.8 percent).
